ABOUT

Steve March-Tormé has been a working singer his whole adult life — the first-born son of Mel Tormé, and a recording and touring artist with a long career of his own. He grew up between two musical worlds: his father's Great American Songbook, and the Top 40 radio he turned on after Yankees games. He performs in configurations from trio to full symphony orchestra, in rooms from the Detroit Jazz Festival to the Smith Center in Las Vegas.

Tormé Sings Tormé

His father's songbook from Marty Paich's original dektette charts, with a ten-piece band — family photographs and film between the numbers.

Steve March-Tormé with Quartet

An evening that starts around Cole Porter and Johnny Mercer and ends at Lennon/McCartney — a virtuoso quartet in a room half the size.

Pop Goes The Decades: Unplugged

The Beatles, Simon & Garfunkel, James Taylor — the radio he grew up on, three voices and acoustic guitars.
